IT'S ONLY A DRILL

On Tuesday, October 10, AMHS will host an EVACUATION DRILL with area first responders. A fire alarm will sound and students, faculty and staff will exit the building as usual. For the purpose of the drill, we will have some students remain in the building to allow first responders to practice their search and rescue skills. We will also have some students act as “burn victims” to allow the first responders to contact the Lifenet medical helicopter which will land on the Fisher Elementary fields. Because of the scope of this exercise, we are notifying students and families that this is just a drill; however, the first responders will treat this as a real event to ensure their understanding when there is an actual emergency.



The drill will take place from approximately 12-1PM with time after for students to speak with the various responders about their careers as firefighters, emergency health care workers and law enforcement officers. **NOTE:** *If your student needs to leave school early on Tuesday or return to school during drill hours, please plan accordingly. Cars may not be able to access the school until after the drill is completed.*

COMMUNITY SERVICE DAY

The annual AMHS Community Service Day is Friday, October 13. Students MUST have parent/guardian permission to participate. Grade 6 students will remain on campus to complete their service work, and parents of students in Grade 7 and Grade 8 must initial on the form whether they prefer their student to be *on campus* or *off campus* for their service project. Forms should be returned to the Guidance Office by Tuesday, October 10. Students without a signed permission form will be assigned to a quiet study hall.
